## *Distinguished Student Applications*

Distinguished Student Applications are available on the NDHSAA website under Forms.

**Objectives & Goals:** To recognize deserving young people who are the “backbone” of interscholastic activities, not necessarily the leader, but the individual whose participation in high school activities strengthens the program for participants, the school and the community.

**Criteria:** Applicant must be a junior the year the application is submitted. Student must be a participant as a player, manager, statistician or other role in at least one NDHSAA sponsored activity in the current year. Note: Participation does not necessarily mean excellence, honors or even active play. Student must be a good citizen and role model to his/her peers as well as a contributor to the community. The committee will evaluate applicants’ essays on their demonstration of sportsmanship and citizenship and how the applicant feels these values derived from activities will provide them lifelong benefits.

**Selection Process:** One applicant per school is allowed. A pre-screening committee will narrow the applicants to six semi-finalists. The final selection will be based upon an interview conducted by a Selection Committee. Immediately following the interviews, the results will be announced at an NDHSAA sponsored luncheon for semi-finalists and their families.

**Deadlines:** Completed application forms must be postmarked no later than April 1. Applications postmarked after April 1 will not be considered. Semi-finalists will be notified by mid-April. Interviews and the luncheon announcing the results will be held the first part of May.

**Awards:** All applicants of the NDHSAA Distinguished Student Program will receive a certificate suitable for framing. A press release naming all applicants will be sent statewide. Semi-finalists will receive a medallion, a Distinguished Student polo shirt and will be featured in the September issue of the NDHSAA publication, the Bulletin. They will also be invited to participate in other functions connected with NDHSAA events. Farmers Union Insurance has graciously funded scholarships for the finalists. The NDHSAA Distinguished Student recipient will receive a gold medallion and a \$2,000 scholarship to the college of his/her choice. The runner-up will receive a silver medallion and a \$1,000 scholarship. The other four semi-finalists will receive a silver medallion and a \$500 scholarship to the college of his/her choice. The Distinguished Student will be invited to be the Grand Marshall of the NDHSAA Parade of Champions and, along with the other semi-finalists, participate in other activities such as serving as the NDHSAA spokesperson for High School Activities Month, promoting the values of activity programs and participating in awarding of trophies at NDHSAA state contests. (Expenses for the finalists will be paid by the NDHSAA for such assignments.)

## *NDHSAA General Assembly Meeting - January 30, 2012*

The NDHSAA General Membership will be meeting at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, January 30, 2012 in the Patterson room of the Bismarck Ramkota Inn. Items on the agenda include welcome from Ashley Barnhart, 2011-12 NDHSAA/US Bank Distinguished Student, announcement of Class A At Large, NDIAAA, and Southeast Class B Representatives who will serve on the NDHSAA Board of Directors; By-Law amendment proposal; presentation of football plan; coaches education report and Executive Secretary report.

The following By-Law amendment proposal is introduced by Richardton-Taylor Public School concerning academic eligibility computation:

**Amendment Proposal:** The proposed amendment is stated below. Please note that the change involves language being struck indicated by bold red strike through text (~~Example Text~~) and additional language being proposed indicated in bold red (**Example Text**).

**SECTION V:** He/she shall be doing passing work in at least twenty hours per week, the passing grade to be computed from the opening of the ~~semester quarter~~ and relative to such subjects only as severally and individually shall have a credit value of one-half unit per semester.

If schools are unable to attend, electronic voting will be utilized. School representatives are reminded electronic votes will be counted in un-amended action only. If agenda items are amended, motion passage or failure will be determined by present representative votes. Electronic voting will be accepted until 8:00 a.m. CDT, January 25, 2012.

## State Gymnastics

Gymnastics State Meet: February 24 & 25, 2012 -Site: Dickinson, Mark Rerick, Manager

### STATE TOURNAMENT TEAM QUALIFICATION

1. The top eight teams will advance to the State Meet using the top 5 team scores from the regular season, which includes the conference meet. There will be no NDHSAA sponsored regional meet.
2. There will be one (1) session.
3. The schedule will be

Friday: All times are Mountain Standard Time - Parade of athletes, introductions, anthem 3:45 p.m., Competition 4:00 p.m.

Detailed Friday (Team Day) Schedule:

- 2:30 p.m. – Gym Opens
- 2:45 p.m. - Coaches' meeting
- 3:00 p.m. - Officials' Meeting and video review for base score
- 3:45 p.m. - Opening Ceremony
- 4:00 p.m. - Begin Competition

NOTE: Timed Warm-ups will be determined by the host school. Previously 1.5 minutes per athlete x 6 competitors, 2 minute equipment change was used.

Teams will be seeded into the Team State Meet by use of simple ranking program. All host teams must report/submit team scores to Kent VanElls immediately after completion of competition, including Conference Meet. Final ranking will be simple average score of the top five regular season competitions in which the team participated.

Example:

Total:  $135+136+137+137+138 = 683$  divided by 5 meets = 136.6 average.

Top ranked teams will meet on floor exercise last round, etc.

8 Team Double groupings

Team "A" is the first seed. Team "B" is the second seed. Etc.

Add time between events for getting ready (including bar settings) during warm-up rotations.

BB and FX touch warm-up procedure: Team listed first touches three gymnasts.

Then the team listed second touches three gymnasts.

BB and FX Competition: Team listed first competes the first gymnast. After that the teams alternate.

Coaches will declare the 6 Team Competition athletes per event by the Monday prior to the State Meet.

### STATE TOURNAMENT INDIVIDUAL QUALIFICATION

1. Individual Qualification will be as follows:

- The top 3 regular season scores including conference will be used to advance the top 40 individuals and top 30 all around to the state meet.
- In the event a senior is unable to complete 3 regular season meets, that senior may advance by an injury petition that is approved by the State Association. To advance to state, the athlete must score equal to or better than the 20th individual score or 15th all around score.

2. The top 3 scores for each athlete must be posted on the NDHSAA website plus any update when an athlete achieves a better score.

3. Conference meet may contribute to the 3 score average.

4. Coaches must submit updates on an individual's score by noon Sunday prior to the State Meet.

5. Top 40 individuals and top 30 all around athletes statewide will qualify to Individual State Meet (no tie-break).

Saturday (Individual Day):

- 11:45 a.m. - Gym Opens
- 12:00 noon - Coaches' Meeting
- 12:30 p.m. - Timed Warm-ups Begin
- 1:30 p.m. - Video review for base score
- 1:45 p.m. - Opening Ceremonies
- 2:00 p.m. - Begin Competition

### NOTE:

(1) Meet manager may view the field each day and adjust the warm-up if needed.

(2) Touch warm-ups will be used for team-day and individual day.

It is recommended to use the individual athlete announcing format and drop back warm up to speed meet up and provide more spectator appeal.

### OTHER REGULATIONS

1. Only high school teams are eligible to enter the State Meet. Junior high teams are not eligible, but junior high girls are eligible for the senior high team.

2. If a girl wishes to compete in the all-around, she must enter all four of the individual events.

3. The meet referee shall not be a high school coach of a competing team.

SPECIAL MEETING: All judges and meet referee will meet one hour prior to the start of competition for pre-meet preparations.

Prior to competition on both days of the State Meet, judges may review videos of routines of the event in which they are assigned. This will take place no later than 1/2 hour prior to the beginning of competition which is during the scheduled judges' meeting.

### STATE WARM-UP SCHEDULE

NOTE: Warm-up starting time will be reviewed by the meet manager for Friday for any necessary adjustments.

### STATE ADMISSION PRICES

1 Day Ticket: Adults - \$10.00, Students - \$5.00

2 Tournament Ticket: Adults - \$18.00, Students - \$8.00

### STATE AWARDS

The top four teams receive a team trophy. In addition, competing members of the championship and runner-up teams will receive individual plaques. In each event, the top six individuals receive plaques and 7th through 15th receive ribbons. Because of the number of ties, individual awards will be ordered following competition.

### JUDGES

A Meet Referee plus Twelve judges - three in each event will be contracted. Scoring shall be tabulated to the ten-thousandths and rounded off to the nearest thousandth.

## *Junior High Regulations*

### General Statement:

In the junior high school if the 9th graders are kept separate for competition and teams are composed strictly of 9th graders, the regulations for each sport are the same as they are for high school teams. Whenever a team is composed of students from grades 7-8-9, 8-9, 7-8, or 7-9, these teams are limited to regulations pertaining to junior high school teams.

### **OVERALL GUIDELINES FOR JUNIOR HIGH COMPETITION (Sport specific regulations below)**

1. Member schools with teams in both junior and senior high school may select pupils in grades 7, 8 or 9 for either junior high teams or as members of high school teams.
2. Seventh and eighth grade students who participate on a ninth grade team declared for high school status may still be eligible for 7th or 8th grade competition.
3. A team made up of a combination of 7th and 8th grade students is considered a junior high team and is subject to those limitations as outlined in the By-Laws. Seventh and eighth grade students elevated to teams consisting of any grades 10 through 12 are no longer eligible for junior high competition. Seventh and eighth grade students may be "moved up" to a 9th grade team.
4. A ninth grade team may be declared for junior high status or high school status and that team must maintain that status the entire season. Ninth grade teams choosing high school status must be comprised of at least 50% ninth grade students.
5. A combination junior high team (8 and 9 or 7, 8 and 9) may compete against a ninth grade team if such combination team has been designated as a high school team.
6. Ninth grade teams having declared high school status MUST follow high school limitations. Teams must be designated as a high school team when the season begins so it is clear they cannot compete against teams with junior high status.
7. If a combination team (8 and 9 or 7, 8 and 9) has less than 50% ninth grade students, that team cannot declare high school status and must follow junior high limitations.
8. All Jr. High seasons shall be no longer than the high school season in each sport. No Jr. High participant may participate in a total number of consecutive weeks in excess of the number of weeks established for the high school season.
9. The total enrollment count applicable to 50 or less enrollment regulations must take place at the beginning of each season in which this rule applies.

### **Boys' and Girls' Basketball:**

Junior High Season: The junior high basketball season shall be no longer than the high school season and each school may set its own starting time.

### **Team Regulations:**

1. No more than fifteen games shall be played by a junior high school team during a season (tournament games included. Any interscholastic game, interscholastic scrimmage, practice game, tournament game or jamboree count as one of the fifteen games. Note: The total enrollment count must take place at the beginning of each season in which this rule is applied. Coops must count all schools that are members of the program. (Not applicable to schools with total enrollment of fifty or less in grades seven and eight; high school regulations apply.)
2. No more than two games per week are permitted except three games during a week provided at least one game is scheduled on a Saturday. (Not applicable to schools with total enrollment of fifty or less in grades seven and eight; high school regulations apply.)
3. Teams shall have at least nine (9) daily practice sessions, counting one per day, prior to the first date of competition.
4. No overnight trips are permitted for junior high teams.
5. It is recommended travel for junior high teams be confined to a radius of 60 miles when reasonable.

### **Individual Regulations:**

1. A junior high individual may not participate in more than 75 quarters (Class B) or 30 halves (Class A) and no more than 5 quarters (Class B) or 2 halves (Class A) in any one day.
2. In the event a junior high team schedules two regular season games on one day, individuals may participate in two games and eight quarters (Class B) or four halves (Class A) provided there is at least one hour between the conclusion of their first game and the start of their next game. No further participation is allowed on that day.
3. Junior high students may compete on both the junior and senior high teams providing they conform to the regulations in 6, 7, and 8. However, once a junior high student in a school with a 7th and 8th grade enrollment of 50 or more competes on a high school team, he/she no longer is eligible for the junior high team. Note: The exception to this rule is in the sports of track, cross-country and wrestling for all schools as well as in all sports for schools with a combined enrollment of less than 50 in the 7th and 8th grade.  
Individual participants are limited to a total of 75 quarters (Class B) or 30 halves (Class A).

## *Junior High Regulations (Continued)*

### **Tournaments:**

1. No district, regional or state tournaments for junior high schools will be organized by the Board of Directors. Any sub-varsity "post-season" tournaments must be included in the regular season game limitation.
2. Each junior high school team is permitted to participate in fifteen regular season games, tournament games included in the fifteen games maximum.

Play Periods: The National Federation rules which provide playing periods of 6 minute quarters for seventh and eighth grade teams shall be followed. There is no regulation addressing the length of halves (Class A).

Officials: NDHSAA registered officials shall be provided in all cases possible. High school students (junior and senior grades) may be used as referees if registered through the NDHSAA high school program.

### **Swimming (Girls' and Boys'):**

1. 7th, 8th, or 9th grade students involved in swimming may compete at either the junior high or senior high level, but cannot compete in more than 2 meets per week or a total of 16 meets in a school year.
2. The junior high swimming season shall be no longer than the high school season and each school may set their own start time.

### **Cross Country:**

1. The season may begin no earlier than the first allowable day for the high school season.
2. Teams shall have at least nine (9) daily practice sessions, counting one per day, prior to the first date of competition. Individuals must have participated in at least 9 daily practice sessions before being permitted to participate in an interscholastic contest.
3. No more than two meets per week are permitted. Meets may not be on consecutive days.
4. The length of the course shall be 3,000 meters.
5. The season ends the same time as the high school season.
6. Seventh, eighth and ninth grade students involved in cross country may compete at either the junior high or senior high level the entire season, but cannot compete in more than two meets per week.

### **Football:**

Sport Season: Football season may open on the same date as the high school football season. Football season shall close on or before the first weekend in November.

1. Practice sessions shall start at least 14 days prior to the first game and there shall be at least 9 daily sessions.
2. Junior high teams may schedule 8 games and one pre-season scrimmage.
3. No more than 6 quarters may be played by an individual (penalty for violation is forfeiture of game in which the violation occurred and the student who violated must sit out the next scheduled day/night of competition).
4. The National Federation rules for playing periods for junior high schools will be followed.
5. Properly fitted equipment of good quality is mandatory for safe participation in football. All essential protective devices are to be used. In addition to the normal pads and helmet, teeth and face protection guards must be provided. Schools unable to equip contestants properly should not offer the program.
6. Proper officiating is a most important safety factor. The use of the "fast whistle" is mandatory.
7. NDHSAA registered officials should be provided in all cases possible and non-registered high school students shall not be used as referees, umpires or head line men.

### **Girls' Gymnastics:**

1. The junior high season shall be 10 weeks long and each school may set its own starting time.
2. Other regulations are the same as for high school girls.

### **Track & Field:**

1. If separate meets are held for each of the junior high grades, then the 9th grade students may follow high school regulations and events. However, if 7th and 8th graders compete against 9th graders then the 9th graders must conform to limits set for junior high. 7th and 8th grade students may not be "moved up" to a 9th grade team. Combining these grades would make the resulting team a junior high team. 9th grade teams must be composed entirely of 9th grade students. Only meets involving high school competition may be considered state qualifying meets.
2. Participants are limited to 4 events.
3. Distance events are the 1600 and 800 meter races. A competitor may run both in a one day meet plus one other running event of 400 meters or less.
4. 7th, 8th and 9th grade students involved in track may compete at either the junior high or senior high level through the entire season. There may be no more than two Junior High meets per week. Those students competing at both levels can compete in three meets per week provided one meet is on a Saturday.

## *Junior High Regulations (Continued)*

### **Volleyball (Girls?):**

1. The junior high volleyball season shall be no longer than the high school season and each school may set its own starting time. Season must be completed by April 1.
2. Matches shall be 2 out of 3 set matches.
3. Teams shall play a maximum of 12 matches and no tournaments or 11 matches and 1 tournament or 10 matches and 2 tournaments or 8 matches and 3 tournaments.
4. Registered Association officials shall be provided in all cases possible. Non-registered high school students shall not be used as referees.
5. There shall be at least 9 daily practice sessions prior to the first match. Individual participants must have participated in at least 9 daily practice sessions before being permitted to participate in an interscholastic contest.

### **Wrestling:**

1. Each school may set its own date for beginning the season. The season for teams and individuals shall not have more weeks than the high school season and said weeks must be consecutive.
2. Practice sessions shall start at least 9 days prior to the first meet and there shall be at least 9 daily sessions. Individuals must have participated in at least 9 daily practices before competing in an interscholastic contest.
3. Each junior high school wrestler is allowed a maximum of TWENTY-FIVE regular season matches. Violation results in ineligibility of said wrestler for the remainder of the year.
4. Junior high matches shall be 1 minute for the first period and 1 1/2 minutes each for the second and third periods. Ties at the end of regulation will be broken as per the National Federation Wrestling Rules Book.
5. The low weight for each wrestler will be established when he/she weighs in for his/her first inter-scholastic match or exhibition. A copy of that weigh-in sheet should be sent to all schools remaining on the school's schedule. Wrestlers may not go to a lower weight. Junior high wrestlers need not be "certified" unless they wrestle on a high school team.
6. Junior high wrestlers will be allowed to wrestle junior high and high school all season (may go back and forth) but are allowed no more than two appearances per week. If a third appearance is made, he/she must remain at the varsity level.
7. No wrestler may wrestle in a total number of weeks in excess of the number of consecutive weeks established for the high school season.
8. No growth allowance.
9. No district, region or state meet will be organized by the Board of Directors. All competitions shall count toward the season limitation.

To submit team scholars through MVP, follow the directions below.

-Log in to MVP

Note: You must have an administrative role at your school

-Click on the Admin wrench on the left side of the page

-Click Team Scholar, which will appear in the grey menu bar

-Choose your sport from the drop down menu

-Enter the GPA for each member of your qualifying team

Note: your team GPA will be automatically calculated

-Click SAVE

-The application is electronically sent to NDHSAA

-An acknowledgement of receipt will be sent to the email address listed in the submission

## *Team Scholar Recipients*

Principals and coaches are reminded that Team Scholar Award applications may be submitted as soon as your school has reached the first grading period. 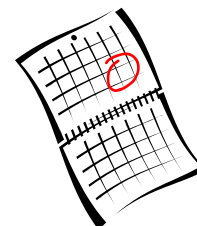
